

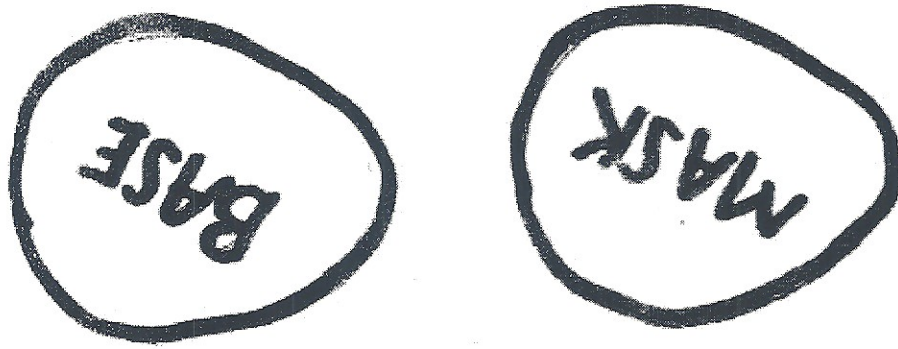
## How to Make the Horror Classic Keychains:

1. Trace the provided shapes onto foam
  - a. For the base shapes, I used black. For Michael Myer's and Jason's masks I used the white foam. For Freddy's face I used red, and for his hat I used brown. This will cut your painting time at the end down.
2. Cut the shapes out.
  - a. Cut out details like eyes (Freddy, Michael, and Jason), and mouths (Freddy only)
3. Paint any details
  - a. **Freddy Krueger:**
    - i. To create a flesh tone for the scarring, mix 2-3 drops white, one drop orange, and one drop brown.
    - ii. His hat band is brown paint unmixed. To create some weathering, I mixed the brown with a little black and painted the edges, etc.
    - iii. He has blue eyes – paint the eyes on the black base foam, so they show through the red foam. (See sample image for help)
    - iv. For his teeth: On the black foam, I did a layer of yellow, then while the layer was a little damp, I painted white in teeth shaped dots. Lastly, use black paint (or a pen) to draw black lines in a teeth pattern.
  - b. **Jason Voorhees:**
    - i. To create the weathering on his mask, I mixed a very small amount of brown in with white paint and dry brushed it on. Increase the ratio of brown paint to add dimension in small areas (see sample image for help.)
    - ii. Use black paint to paint the holes in in his mask on (see sample image for pattern), and to paint on the straps that hold his mask on. Use red paint for the arrow/line shapes on his mask.
    - iii. On the black foam, paint his eyes. His skin color is grey, so paint a grey base where the eye holes will be. He has black eyes, but one of his eyelids is significantly heavier than the other. Paint white in a half circle for one eye, then a full circle for the other. Add a black circle for his iris.
  - c. **Michael Myers:**
    - i. Use a very light grey (like 5 drops white to a ½ drop of black) to paint his face shapes in. (use sample images). Increase the ratio of black for any areas that require more depth, such as his nose/nostrils, and his lips.
    - ii. Use brown paint for his eyebrows. They are very round and thin.
    - iii. For his hair: use light brush strokes in different colors to create a high/low light effect to mimic hair strands. I used brown paint, but would sometimes lightly dab my loaded brown brush in white or black to give it dimension.
4. On the very top of the black base, glue an 'O' ring (see image if you need help).
5. Then glue on your masks, hair, hats, etc. The top pieces should line up evenly to your bottom piece.
6. Finally, thread the 'O' ring through a key chain ring, and TA-DA, you're done!
